

THE PHILLY POE MANIFESTO


2009 IS THE BICENTENNIAL of Edgar Allan Poe's birth. Poe, in case you hadn't heard, wrote most of his greatest works while living in Philadelphia. Poe's genius flourished here in the early 1840s. Philly, in all its tumbling mess of democracy, strife, toil and glory, is the kind of place where the greatest American writer needed to be, to hone his vision, to perfect his craft. His writing career was set afire in a flaming channel of literature known as Philadelphia Gothic.

The six years Poe spent living in Philly were the most productive and successful of his writing career. Poe became a great writer while living in Philadelphia. While here he wrote the stories we still read: The Fall of the House of Usher, The Black Cat, The Pit and the Pendulum, The Masque of Red Death, William Wilson and The Tell-Tale Heart. Poe invented the mystery/detective story with The Murders in the Rue Morgue and began writing his masterpiece, The Raven, while living in Philadelphia.

Philly was the crucible for Poe's imagination. And Poe is the creative genius for our city today, unafraid to show the wicked parts of the human soul. Willing to work hard and keep pursuing the dream, even when life kept knocking him down. Off-center, but firm in his conviction that his was the right way to look at the world. And in the end, he was right.

That's why we still read him.

The Poe Bicentennial starts here. Don't come to Philly for the Liberty Bell. You've seen a thousand pictures of it in your lifetime. Don't come for Ben Franklin. Read his Autobiography. Don't come for Rocky Balboa. Watch his movies. Come for Poe. He lived in Philly, wrote his greatest works in Philly and represents all that is inspiring and terrifying about not only Philadelphia, but about America. — Edward Pettit, the "Philly Poe Guy"


